The “Blanket Exercise”: this powerful interactive exercise educates participants by moving groups through the history of Indigenous peoples in Canada.

United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples: workshop participants read for understanding & action

Truth and Reconciliation: visiting the 94 TRC Commission’s recommendations for Canadians, developing ideas on carrying these forward in our lives, families, and communities.

Exploring the Treaties: reviewing the appropriate Treaty for each workshop’s location, while inviting discussion on historic and modern perspectives, how this Treaty has been and could be upheld.

Indigenous Water Governance: exploring pre-contact water laws, agreements, and treaties, while asking the question; can there be an Indigenous Water Governance model for Canada?

Community Climate Action surveying current climate science, emergency preparedness, and the Government of Alberta's new energy efficiency and solar programs. Sharing assessments for designing a solar installation, along with preparing, distributing, and evaluating solar

requests for proposals. Keepers of the Athabasca will follow up and assist workshop participants to plan and contract your new solar installation in Northern Alberta.
